The Hume Community for Respect and Equality of Women (CREW) will take to the streets at the Unity Festival in Craigieburn to help stop violence against women.

The Hume CREW – an alliance of local community organisations seeking to create a safer community for women and girls – will stage a walk at Mount Ridley P-12 College's **Unity Festival** to raise awareness about the issue of preventing violence against women. As part of the **16 Days of Activism to End Gendered Violence**, the walk will commence at 9am, Saturday 9 December at Mt Ridley College, 2–30 Hampton Street, Craigieburn. It will be a two kilometre route that includes a section of Grand Boulevard.

Hume CREW alliance members are excited about the opportunity

to get the message out there, stating "This is a cause we are all passionate about and everyone is welcome to turn up to show their support and walk with us. We know the majority of Hume want a safe and inclusive community for women, and action like this is one way of demonstrating it."
